Comprehensive School Improvement Plan Goals

1	Collaborate to increase the percentage of students ready for Kindergarten from 45.1% in 2015 to 58.0% by 10/01/16 as measured by the Brigance Early Childhood Screen.
2	Collaborate to ensure that teachers have autonomy to make decisions about instruction, from 40.9% in 2015 to 70.5% by 06/01/17 as measured by the 2017 Tell KY Survey results.
3	Collaborate to increase our Program Review Arts & Humanities average overall score of 9.4 in 2015 to 10.0 by 06/01/16 as measured by the school report card.
4	Collaborate to increase the average combined reading and math KPrep proficiency scores from 64.5% in 2015 to 69.4% by 10/01/16 as measured by the school report card.
5	Collaborate to increase the percentage of 3 rd grade students scoring proficient and distinguished in reading on KPrep from 65.1% in 2015 to 69.4% by 10/01/16 as measured by the school report card.
6	(A) Collaborate to increase the achievement for students in the special education gap group so the percentage of proficient and distinguished students increases in the area of reading from 51% in 2015 to 59.6% in 2016; and in math, from 49.4% in 2015 to 59.0% in 2016 as measured by the school report card. (B) Collaborate to increase the achievement for students in the Limited English Proficiency gap group so the percentage of proficient and distinguished students increases from 16.7% in 2015 to 36.5% in 2016 by 10/01/16 as measured by the school report card delivery
7	targets. Collaborate to increase the achievement of students in reading by reducing the percentage of novice students from 9.5% in 2015 to 8.55% by 06/01/16 as measured by the school report card.
8	Collaborate to create a plan to increase the awareness of the district and school wellness policies to all faculty members to 100% by 06/01/16 as measured by survey results.
9	A 13% increase of all students will demonstrate a proficiency on KPrep in Writing by 10/01/16 as measured by the school report card.
