<b><u>Proficiency</u></b>	<p>By 2019, River Ridge Elementary will increase the combined reading and math percentage of students scoring proficient/distinguished from 64.2% in 2017 to 81% as measured by the school report card.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> - Increase our percentage of student scoring proficient/distinguished in reading from 66.2% to 77.1% in 2018 as measured by the school report card.</p> <p><b>Math</b> - increase our percentage of students scoring proficient/distinguished in math from 62.1% to 77.3% in 2018 as measured by the school report card.</p>
<b><u>Gap</u></b>	<p>By 2019, River Ridge Elementary will increase the combined reading and math percentage of students in the non-duplicated gap group scoring proficient/distinguished from 51% in 2017 to 74.6% as measured by the school report card.</p>	<p><b>Reading</b> - Increase our percentage of students in the non-duplicated gap group scoring proficient/distinguished in reading from 52.3% in 2017 to 69.7% in 2018 as measured by the school report card.</p> <p><b>Math</b> - Increase our percentage of students in the non-duplicated gap group scoring proficient/distinguished in math from 49.6% in 2017 to 69.3% in 2018 as measured by the school report card.</p>
